**The Day Of The Owl** Oct 05 2021 In the piazza, a man lies dead. No one will say if they witnessed his killing. This presents a challenge to the investigating officer, a man who earnestly believes in the values of a democratic and modern society. Indeed, his enquiries are soon blocked off by a wall of silence and vested interests; he must work against the community to save it and expose the truth. The narrative moves on two levels: that of the investigator, who reveals a chain of savage crimes; and that of the bystanders and watchers, of those complicit with secret power, whose gossipy, furtive conversations have only one end - to stop the truth coming out. This novel about the Mafia is also a mesmerizing demonstration of how that organization sustains itself. It is both a beautifully, tautly written story and a brave act of denunciation.

*Dissipatio H.G.* Nov 25 2020 A fantastic and philosophical vision of the apocalypse by one of the most striking Italian novelists of the twentieth century. From his solitary buen retiro in the mountains, the last man on earth drives to the capital Chrysopolis to see if anyone else has survived the Vanishing. But there's no one else, living or dead, in that city of "holy plutocracy," with its fifty-six banks and as many churches. He'd left the metropolis to escape his fellow humans and their struggles and ambitions, but to find that the entire human race has evaporated in an instant is more than he had bargained for. Italian Literature in the Nuclear Age Mar 10 2022 Italian Literature in the Nuclear Age: A Poetics of the Bystander explores the overlooked position of the bystander in the Nuclear Age by focusing on the Italian situation as a

paradigmatic case. Host to hundreds of American atomic weapons while lacking a nuclear arsenal of its own, Italy's status was an ambiguous one: that of an unwilling—and in many ways passive—accomplice. Inspired by Seamus Heaney's dictum that "there is no such thing as innocent by-standing," the book frames Italy's fraught mix of implication and powerlessness not only as a geopolitical question, but as a way to rethink the role of the sidelined intellectual in the face of mass extinction. *Italian Literature in the Nuclear Age* includes discrete chapters on the major Italian intellectuals of the time: Italo Calvino, Alberto Moravia, Elsa Morante, Pier Paolo Pasolini, and Leonardo Sciascia. Conscious of their own political marginalization, these authors address the atomic question through a wide range of experimental forms, approaching the nearly unthinkable theme in allusive and oblique ways. Often dismissed as disengaged, inconsistent, or merely playful, these works demand instead a political reading capable of recognizing their confrontation with the paradoxes of the nuclear age.

In its conclusions, the book suggests that to meet the challenge of representation posed by terrorism fiction rather than fact is the writer’s best friend and most effective tool.

Non a caso la raccolta si apre sull’interrogativo «Come si può essere siciliani?», e prosegue poi con splendide ‘inquisizioni’ che hanno al centro la Sicilia e insieme la letteratura, il cinema, la pittura, la fotografia: come quella sulla Biblioteca Lucchesiana di Girgenti, emblema dell’avversione alla «lue dei libri», dove Pirandello, nel 1889, trovò cinque preti e tre carabinieri «intenti a divorare un’insalata di cocomeri e pomidori» e manoscritti frequentati solo da topi e scarafaggi; o, ancora, quella sull’«Omnibus» di Longanesi e sugli scrittori nati fra il 1905 e il 1908 (fra cui Brancati), pleiade generazionale accomunata dal guardare altrove - e che, esemplarmente indagata da Sciascia, ci rivela come il fascismo fosse un fenomeno ben più complesso, disarticolato e contraddittorio di quanto possa apparire nei libri di storia.

Ettore Majorana was born in the Sicilian city of Catania. He joined Enrico Fermi's 'Via Panisperna boys' at an early age and was part of the team who first discovered the slow neutrons (the research that would lead to the nuclear reactor and eventually, the atomic bomb). Enrico Fermi considered him one of the brightest scientists, comparable to Galileo and Newton. On March 25, 1938, Ettore Majorana mysteriously disappeared at 31. When the author moved to the University of Catania, Sicily, from Milan University back in 1968, he soon discovered important documents pertaining to Majorana's life and works. Together with his own investigative materials and full cooperation from Majorana's family members, he published a book on his disappearance in Italian (after having helped the famous Italian writer, Leonardo Sciascia, to write down his known Essay, by supplying him with copy of some of the discovered documents). Recami's book was entitled *Il Caso Majorana — Epistolario, Documenti, Testimonianze* and when it first appeared in Italy, it drew interest from all the major newspapers, publications and TVs & broadcast media. Even after his disappearance, Ettore Majorana's name appeared in many areas of frontier physics research, ranging from elementary particle physics to applied condensed matter, to mathematical physics, and more. His long lasting contributions is a testimony of his brilliance and farsightedness and has continued to draw interest from scientists not only in Italy, but from all over the world until today. An English version of the original is very appropriate at this juncture, when more and more scholars in the world are getting convinced that he was really a genius 'like Galileo and Newton'. This book traces the extraordinary life of Ettore Majorana — through his letters, documents and testimonies from his friends and family members. What makes this book more fascinating (as a detective-story too) is his mysterious disappearance at young age. This book, therefore, is both a biography and a mystery book.

**L'adorabile Stendhal** Oct 25 2020 Ha detto Sciascia, a proposito di «adorabile»: «Può darsi che questa parola io l'abbia qualche volta scritta, e sicuramente più volte l'ho pensata: ma per una sola donna e per un solo scrittore. E lo scrittore – forse è inutile dirlo – è Stendhal». Sciascia aveva per Stendhal un'ammirazione intima e appassionata (lo leggeva «in continua rotazione», e sempre facendo capo alla «Certosa di Parma»), imparagonabile a quella che nutriva per altri autori. Un'ammirazione che è anzitutto mimesi, identificazione – e che come tale corre, simile a un fiume sotterraneo, in molti suoi romanzi –, ma che, se si guarda agli scritti qui per la prima volta radunati, ha assunto forme molteplici e inaspettate. Come osserva Massimo Colesanti, Sciascia è stato insieme stendhaliano e stendhalista. Da romanziere ha intuito «le strutture e gli scatti psicologici più riposti» della scrittura di Stendhal, ma, da vero lettore-detective, ha anche indagato «i congegni, le “finzioni”, i trucchi, di cui quella scrittura è costruita», e ha saputo sventare depistaggi e mistificazioni, smascherando Stendhal – e seguendo dunque a ritroso quel percorso, a lui ben caro, che muove dalla cronaca e sboccia nell'invenzione.

**Sicilian Uncles** Aug 03 2021 The expression 'Sicilian uncle' has the same sense in Italian as 'Dutch uncle' does in English, but with sinister overtones of betrayal and inconstancy. The four novellas in Sicilian Uncles, originally published in 1958, are political thrillers of a kind - the first fruits of Sciascia's maturity. In these stories, illusions about ideology and history are lost in mirth, suffering and abandoned innocence. Each novella has its historical moment: the Allied invasion of Sicily, the Spanish Civil War, the death of Stalin, the 'events' of 1848. These occasions and their consequences are registered in the lives of Sciascia's wonderfully drawn characters. Each has voice, wit and a private history which opens out onto the wider circumstances of his time.
